
Gathering Together

Dear Friends,

On Sunday morning, I shared some plans for Christian Formation--how we gather together go grow deeper in our relationship with God and with each other. Watch for an email with a full plan, but in the meantime, we're going to gather on some Tuesday evenings, after Bread+Belonging, for a start.

We are beginning with adding the service of Compline at 6:50pm every Tuesday at the end of Bread+Belonging.

Beginning on Tuesday, October 10 (next Tuesday, not tomorrow), you're invited to come join a study of The Art of Gathering, by Priya Parker. I've been really excited about using this book since I read it during COVID, and



now we have an opportunity. It made me think about everything we do as church-gathering to worship, to eat, to study, to sing, to pray, and how we might do so

differently and intentionally.

We'll work through it on Tuesday evenings, with something like 3 weeks on, a week off. Gather in the Chapel at 7pm and plan to stay until 8:15pm. All ages are welcome--if you need nursery care, let me know and we'll have it staffed. If you want to come 10 minutes earlier and join us for Compline, please do.


