Dear Friends,

I'm wondering about **Sunday School**. Since before COVID, St. Aidan's has struggled with both regular leaders/teachers and also gathering a regular group of children. We are not alone in this struggle--many congregations of our size and staffing are with us.

We began a **collaborative youth group** in the spring with 6 other congregations--the **BeLoved!** group. That group, for 6th to 12th grades, meets monthly and starts again on **Sunday, August 20 from 4-6pm,** meeting at St. Andrew Presbyterian in Boulder. Sharing this work is really important, for kids and for the grownups who support them.

Providing for the care and formation of children when we gather on Sunday mornings matters--what matters about it to you? We need to share and teach the stories of our faith. Our youngest members are also full persons in the body of Christ, and there is something good in gathering all together for church, singing together, praying, receiving Holy Communion. Sometimes parents need a rest too--we have great Nursery Care, but right now we don't have volunteers for more Children's Formation, or we haven't for a while. Many of our leaders are already working to tend to worship, leadership, and ministry.

How could we be different, and find the right solution for St. Aidan's, in this time and place? I would like to hear from you if you have ideas.



Visioning & Discernment Update

The question before us is this: what is God calling St. Aidan's to be, to do, and to look like 75 years from now?

This update was shared at church services on Sunday, July 9.

Discernment Update + July 9, 2023 Paul Voakes, Senior Warden

Here's a **brief update** on our discernment process, which has now begun its second year of exploring our parish's long-term future.

Earlier this year our Visioning Committee morphed into the Partnerships Team, which has been slowly, deliberately, identifying possible partners who might be able to help us attain the goals we articulated in our voting process last fall. These potential partners include religious neighbors on the block (first and foremost Hillel, but also the Wesley Foundation and University Lutheran Chapel); a Jewish congregation in North Boulder looking for space to share; community organizations such as Boulder Philharmonic, Parlando School of Musical Arts, and the Northern Colorado YMCA (whose primary interest in talking to us is providing affordable child care to the Boulder community); a private development company that is deeply committed to enhancing religious life on CU campus, and of course CU itself. We've had very preliminary "getting to know you" conversations with all of the above, and they've all been very positive.

And now: We've arrived at a point where we realize that we need legal expertise, financial expertise, city-politics expertise, and real estate expertise that we simply don't have. Thanks to the extraordinary generosity of our congregation, we are able to afford a consultant to help us into a more sophisticated stage of planning. We received two bids for consultant work, and the Vestry has accepted the better of the two: a bid from Trestle Strategies. This firm has a long record of successful work in Boulder. Their work includes consulting on the University Hill Hotel, the CU Conference Center, the Millennium redevelopment, the mixed-use development at Boulder Junction, and many, many more.

The founder and owner, Danica Powell is a former member of the City of Boulder Planning Department, and she would personally lead the work on the St. Aidan's project.

Trestle's proposal is a detailed, three-stage plan to:

- Conduct a 10-part property analysis during July and August, including our longoverdue property appraisal, to give us the baseline information we will need going forward in conversation with potential partners.
- Conduct a 12-week Needs Assessment and Engagement, with both the St. Aidan's congregation and potential partners, from September to November. Please stay tuned for invitations to participate! The key document at the end of this stage will be their "Summary of Findings and Recommendations. "
- Craft a Real Estate Strategy: a road map to help us make the key real estate decisions we will need to make over the following several months.

The Partnerships Team and Vestry are excited, and eager to move to these next steps. I also want to reiterate the Vestry's reassurance that **St. Aidan's isn't going anywhere!** Whatever we may decide, we will do our best to ensure that St. Aidan's has the financial wherewithal to continue indefinitely where we are right now, as an Episcopal parish, and that we'll keep asking the Holy Spirit to guide us in ways that deepen our faith and strengthen our service to the community.
