SAINT AIDAN'S EPISCOPAL CHURCH 75th ANNUAL PARISH MEETING MINUTES Sunday, February 12, 2023

The 75th Saint Aidan's Annual Parish Meeting was opened at 11:05.

- Quorum definition and declaration
 - A quorum was defined as 1/2 of pledging households or 37 households as of February 7th
 - 50 households were counted between in-person attendees and zoom attendees were counted; quorum was declared.
- Voting Process
 - Visual voting will be by raised hands
 - Zoom voting will be by raised hands on video or use of the reactions
- Appointment of Secretary- Kim Keffeler, Vestry Clerk, was appointed as the Secretary of the Annual Meeting
- Motion on minutes of 2022
 - Bal Patterson moved to accept the minutes, Matt Clark seconded; all in favor, so moved.
- Annual Report of 2022
 - The Reverend Mary Kate Rejouis shared the Annual Report; copies are distributed throughout the Parish Hall and were emailed to the parish on Tuesday February 7.
- Vestry Member Melanie Sokhey spoke on hospitality
 - Hospitality is a precious tradition in our church, we need to take the time to rebuild community with each other, especially at coffee hour
 - Coffee Hour has been run by a few dedicated volunteers in 2022- Warren Taylor, Sheryl Bain, Gillian Brown, Kandance Einbeck, Bronwyn Fraser, Sarah Sokhey, and Melanie Sokhey.
 - We need more people to step up and help!
 - The Vestry agreed to explore growing and reenergizing hospitality:

- A short-term working group will convene by zoom to plan what we can do for hospitality in 2023. Congregants were encouraged to sign up on the easel in the Parish Hall.
- Leadership: Elections, Appointments, and Thanksgivings
 - Elections of 2022 Candidates for 3 year terms: Kim Keffeler, Bev Robinson, and Melanie Sokhey
 - A motion to approve by acclamation was declared, the motion passed.
 - Appointment of Wardens: Paul Voakes as Senior Warden; Tom Sturm as Junior Warden
 - Thank you to departing members: Kevin Criley and Grace Pierce
 - A gift was presented to Kevin Criley; Grace Pierce was not in attendance
 - Thank you to Sarah Sokhey for her shortened term
 - Thank you to continuing members: Mary Martin, Tom Sturm, Paul Voakes, Jennie Garcia, Carina Julig, Matthew Stolte, Amy Paine (Treasurer), and Donna Colville (Assistant Treasurer)
- Treasurer's Report (written by Amy Paine, presented by Paul Voakes)
 - One page statement of 2022 Financials, 2023 Budget, and Financial Position
 - Parking income has become a substantial portion of our income
 - Pre-Covid it was 1/3 of our income
 - This year, projecting it will 1/2 of our income
 - We are passing a deficit budget again this year
 - We have always passed a deficit budget, and usually the parish comes through in marvelous ways
 - This prevents us from cutting back unnecessary on staff and facilities when the money usually comes in in one way or another.
 - Summary- We are in a good place:
 - We have \$328,000 in operating checking
 - Our endowment balances are in a good place. We do not intend to take endowment distributions this year
 - Balance Sheet as of 12/31/2022
- Nominations of person to serve as Delegates to Diocesan Convention (October 5-7 in Grand Junction, CO); delegates will be appointed by the Vestry in July 2023 from among these Kandace Einbeck, Nancy Jordan, Heidi Huff, Kim Keffeler (maybe), Mary Martin
- Announcements and Thanksgivings
 - Lent formation - Bless the Lent We Actually Have by Kate Bowler
 - This will be presented on Sunday mornings, Tuesday evenings by Zoom, and 3 Wednesday evening potlucks
 - Mardi Gras is coming on Tuesday February 21st at 530
 - Keith and a great collection of musicians will have a bluegrass jam
 - It's a Potluck- Bring food and friends
 - Ash Wednesday is February 22nd
 - Amanda Barker shared that she is discerning bringing/leading a contemplative/ centering prayer group to Saint Aidan's.
- Sheryl Bain led the parish in A Litany of Thanksgiving for a Church (BCP 578)
